



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
EPA Enforcement Organizational Structure BRACEWELL

OECA in the 2nd Obama Term



- NSR enforcement OECA views NSR as the only CAA program that substantially reduces air emissions
 - Enforcement justified internally given court decisions on major rules.
- Other enforcement media to follow air enforcement model of targeting industry-wide alleged compliance issues
- Centralization of EPA enforcement
 - Increased OECA oversight of Regional offices and pressure on States

Increased Enforcement



- OECA and DOJ working together
 - Filing of judicial cases and less patience in settlement
 - Re-activation of pending cases and referrals at DOJ
 - Revisiting of past settlements to make them more stringent
- Aggressive use of the Office of Compliance for targeting purposes and use of applicability determinations to make enforcement easier
- Settlement demands
 - Super-compliance with regulations
 - Tighter compliance schedules
 - Increased penalty demands
 - Less generous liability releases in settlements

OECA and GHG Policy Development



- OECA has traditionally played a large policy role at EPA
- During first term, OECA was a silent partner at the GHG table
- Enforcement as a tool to advance policy decisions
 - Regulation by enforcement It is fast (examples LDAR and Flares)
 - Advancement of GHG reducing measures and CCS in settlements (environmental projects)
 - Forcing the shutdown/repowering of units by insisting on noncost effective controls and then taking GHG credit
 - Enforcement of GHG emission rule and using data from rule
