

COMBINED HEAT AND POWER

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SOMETIMES CALLED COGENERATION

GENERATE ELECTRICITY WITH WASTE HEAT USED FOR SECONDARY PURPOSE

DICOTAMY:

• LARGE MACHINES THAT SELL PRIMARILY TO GRID

• BEHIND THE METER ON-SITE GENERATION

CURRENTLY APPROXIMATELY
4400 INSTALLATIONS WITH 82.7
GW NATIONALLY (8% OF
CAPACITY BUT 12% OF ACTUAL
GENERATION)

REPORTED ENERGY EFFICIENCY OF APPROXIMATELY 65% TO 85%

PURPA (1978)

• NO SIZE LIMITATION ON COGENERATION

• UTILITY MUST PURCHASE AT AVOIDED COST

CHANGES SINCE INCEPTION OF PURPA:

• ORIGINALLY - A PATHWAY TO DEVELOPING LARGE NON-UTILITY GENERATION

• NOW – MORE TRULY TWO USES OF ENERGY



REASONS FOR CHANGE:

- EWG AND OPEN ACCESS TRANSMISSION UNDER ENERGY POLICY ACT OF 1992
- RESTRICTIONS ON COGENERATION IN THE ENERGY POLICY ACT OF 2005



BEING A PURPA COGEN QF STILL MAY HAVE BENEFIT

- MUST PURCHASE PROVISION WHERE NO COMPETITIVE RTO
- WHERE COMPETITIVE RTO MUST PURCHASE WHEN LESS THAN 20MW



PURCHASING PRACTICES OF VERTICALLY INTEGRATED UTILITIES VARY WHERE NO COMPETIVE RTO

DRIVERS FOR INSTALLATION:

- NEW BUILDING OR INDUSTRIAL APPLICATION OR EXPANDED CAMPUS
- NEED TO REPLACE OR AUGMENT ON-SITE BOILERS
- ECONOMIC INCENTIVES

CAN IN SOME CASES BE USED AS EMERGENCY GENERATION (ISLANDING CAPABILITY) BUT NEED CONTROLS
