




# 2018 ELECTION OVERVIEW

- Several races still undecided




# The House

- Committee priorities





#### FOCUS OF MESSAGING HEARINGS & PROPOSALS

- Climate change
  - Reinstatement of the House Select Committee on Climate
  - Zero carbon vs 100% renewable
- Tax Cuts and Jobs Act
  - The new "repeal and replace"
- Impacts of messaging activities
  - Deliver on campaign promises
  - Slow advancement of Administration's agenda
  - Building blocks for future policy success

### WHAT CAN DC GET DONE BEFORE 2020?

- Any success depends on bicameral, bipartisan support
- Environment
  - Carbon Capture
  - Renewable Fuel Standard
- Tax
  - extenders/technical corrections/retirement & savings
  - middle class tax cut(?)
- Infrastructure
  - Energy infrastructure and environmental streamlining
  - Impending insolvency of the Highway Trust Fund





### TRUMP PRE-2020

- All actions fall under one of two main categories:
  - Energy dominance
  - Regulatory Reform
- Any regulations need to be done as early as possible in 2019
  - Inevitable legal challenges
  - Limit CRA opportunities
